Recipe of the Month

Apple coffee cake

5 cups tart apples, cored, peeled and chopped
 1 cup sugar
 1 cup dark raisins
 1/2 cup pecans, chopped
 1/4 vegetable oil
 2 teaspoons vanilla
 1 egg, beaten
 2 1/2 cups sifted all-purpose flour
 1 1/2 teaspoons baking soda
 2 teaspoons cinnamon

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Lightly oil a 13x9x2 inch pan.

In a large mixing bowl, combine apples with sugar, raisins and pecans. Mix well. Let stand 5 minutes. Stir in oil, vanilla, and eggs. Sift together flour, soda, and cinnamon; stir into apple mixture, just enough to moisten dry ingredients.

Turn batter into pan. Bake 35 to 40 minutes. Cook cake slightly before serving.

Alano Club Member Milton Brock

In 1978 Milton Brock 1st walked up the steps of the Alano Club. In 1980 he moved to Berkeley, CA. Where he got clean. Then in 1982 he ran into a fuzzy, black haired man by the name of Tony Baron. With 2 years clean, in 1982, Milton became a member of the Alano Club of San Jose. At that time dues were \$8.00. Milton has always tried to support the Alano Club, because he found a home away from home. Of course, since then (25 Years Ago) the dues have been raised to only \$20.00 a month.

Milton has many memories of the Alano Club. Our Alano club use to participate in softball tournaments and you can see the trophies above the book case. The Alano club use to charter buses to 49er, Raider, and A's games, Also to the World conference in San Diego 1995. You can see the picture in the meeting room. He also remembers Solomon falling through the roof in the meeting room, feet dangling through the ceiling. Luckily, there wasn't a meeting going on.

Milton had been here through the NA wars when Drugs were prevalent in the 80's. NA was having a hard time and AA was struggling with that. 80% of the people coming in were both. He remembers 1984 Cocaine to the 1988 Crack Milton has been through all the changes.

"The Alano club has been a port in the storm of life too many times to mention. Even though I belong to both Alano clubs, this is the Mother club because everyone here drops to the same level. This is where you feel comfortable even you when you don't want to be comfortable. Everything you want in sobriety is here. Service Work, Employment and Entertainment. Most of all once you get to know this place you can't put a price on the love that flows in and out of these rooms", "Even though I've been a member for 26 years. If it had not been for Tony Baron we would not have been able to carry this club over the hurdles in recovery, that so many other clubs fail to make it over even out of the gate" - Milton
