12 step meetings held here at the club

Ever wonder about the meetings held here at our club? Below are bits of information about each recovery meeting. Note that we are not promoting them, instead we are providing information about them. The content below was taken directly from each entity's website.

Alcoholics Anonymous

What is Alcoholics Anonymous?

We are a Fellowship of men and women who have lost the ability to control our drinking and have found ourselves in various kinds of trouble as a result of drinking. We attempt—most of us successfully—to create a satisfying way of life without alcohol. For this we find we need the help and support of other alcoholics in A.A.

What happens at an A.A. meeting?

An A.A. meeting may take one of several forms, but at any meeting you will find alcoholics talking about what drinking did to their lives and personalities, what actions they took to help themselves, and how they are living their lives today.

Cocaine Anonymous

What is Cocaine Anonymous?

Cocaine Anonymous is a fellowship of men and women who share their experience, strength and hope with each other that they may solve their common problem, and help others to recover from their addiction."

The best way to reach someone is to speak to them on a common level. The members of C.A. are all recovering addicts who maintain their individual sobriety by working with others. We come from various social, ethnic, economic and religious backgrounds, but what we have in common is addiction.

What is the definition of a Cocaine Anonymous group?

A meeting is when two or more people gather together to share their experience, strength and hope with each other. A meeting may call itself a C.A. Group when: The only requirement for membership is a desire to stop using cocaine and all other mind-altering substances.

Co-Dependents Anonymous (CoDA)

What is Co-Dependents Anonymous?

Co-Dependents Anonymous is a fellowship of men and women whose common purpose is to develop healthy relationships. The only requirement for membership is a desire for healthy and loving relationships. We gather together to support and share with each other in a journey of self-discovery -- learning to love the self. Living the program allows each of us to become increasingly honest with ourselves about our personal histories and our own codependent behaviors.

What is a CoDA meeting?

Attending meetings is necessary for recovery in the CoDA program. A codependent attends meetings for his/her personal recovery, and this attendance benefits everyone, its what creates the group. At meetings, we share our experience, strength, and hope in our program of recovery.

Narcotics Anonymous

What is Narcotics Anonymous?

NA is a nonprofit fellowship or society of men and women for whom drugs had become a major problem. We ... meet regularly to help each other stay clean. ... We are not interested in what or how much you used ... but only in what you want to do about your problem and how we can help.

Crystal Meth Anonymous

What is CMA?

Crystal Meth Anonymous is a fellowship of people for whom all drugs, particularly methamphetamines, have become a problem. The only requirement for membership is a desire to stay clean and lead a sober life. The members of Crystal Meth Anonymous meet regulary, share support and fellowship, and create a safe environment in which to stay clean.
