Prayer of the Heart

When I came to Alcoholics Anonymous, I didn't think that the Lord's Prayer could possible work for me, but I also knew that my own perceptions of what would or wouldn't work were all screwed up. I was in no state to figure out what parts of AA wer necessary and what weren't, so I did everything. Surrendering to the wisdom of people who were managing to stay sober was essential. I was told that if I wanted what you had, I had to do what you did, and that seemed to include the Lord's Prayer.

The longer I stayed sober, the more my faither in a Higher Power of my own understanding grew and evolved. By the time I'd been sober for six or seven years, this faith had developed into something very different from the theology expressed in the Lord's Prayer. I started changing a word here and a word there in that prayer so I could say it and still be true to my own belief. I reached a point where I was doing so much rewriting it seemed silly, so I let my mouth say the Lord's Prayer on autopilot while I mentally prayed the prayer that was in my heart.

This worked fine for several year. Then, about a year ago, that method of praying began to feel like another layer of the onion ready to be peeled away. I stopped saying the Lord's Prayer, and now I say my heart's prayer, quietly, so as not to distract the people around me.

It amazes me that this is so easy and so comfortable. I can still participate fully in the Fellowship and can let "all that is within me bless God's holy name" together with the rest of my AA family, without having to say a prayer that isn't true to my own beliefs or experience.

Occasionally someone will tell me to "keep comin' back," that I'll get the spiritual part of the program if I just stick around long enough. Such folks challenge me to practice patience, tolerance, and the biting of my tongue. I can also pray silently that they will stick around long enough to understand the principles of AA.

The Big Book says, "We found the Great Reality deep down within us. In the last analysis it is only there that it may be found." And I know the importance of the idea "To your own self be true."


