As many of you know, the Alano Club of San Jose hosts an annual celebration every October – the Heritage Dinner. It is an honor for the Board of Directors to provide an evening of excellence, including a four-course dinner, an extensive raffle drawing, and two key speakers sharing their experience over time in the 12 step community while also here at the Alano Club over the years.

This year, one of our club members, Michael Johnson, highly recommended that we meet Paul Furiosi, who he had regarded as "one of the best chefs in the valley." I took his advice, and in one short sentence, I could easily sum it up with "Paul was amazing to work with from starting to finish."

As I do not have much "writing real estate" here, I'll keep it brief – but let me just say that I could go on and on about Paul's business ethics, professional values, service importance, joining-in attitude – and the example that he presents himself as when it comes to community service.

Paul did an exceptional job at not only keeping food costs down by reaching out to his food vendors for donations, but he also incurred an additional cost of \$600 out of his own pocket to help out the club. In addition, he provided dinnerware, silverware, and many other items – saving the club an additional expense of \$800 in rentals.

Paul provided all of the labor – two additional chefs the day before, several employees the day of the event, and he personally was involved from start to finish.

As one of the attendees of the dinner said, "the food was off the hook!" – Paul prepared an outstanding 5-star dinner. If you've never been to his restaurant, By-Th'-Bucket, you're missing out on his excellence in preparing the best food, walking through the doors with that feeling of "Welcome, we're glad you are here!" – and once again, the humility and generosity of a good man who genuinely gives from the heart.

Tammy A – Why I Am a Member of the ALANO Club

She's a Cook, a Cashier, a Mother, a Grandmother – and a very essential part of the ALANO Club Café. As I began the interview, I complimented Tammy on the beautiful omelets and then she replied, "I've been told that I cook very well. My omelets look like an omelet, according to my customers."

Tammy A. has been affiliated with the ALANO Club since 2004. In 2005 she became a dues paying member, and has been a member ever since. "This is a non-profit organization, so I know that my monthly dues help support the club. I started working here in the Café in 2005 as a Cashier and a Cook. I've worked here off and on since 2005. What I love about my job is working with our guests. I am learning how important it is to have a good working relationship with my co-workers. Since 2005 I have seen many employees come and go."

She first came to the ALANO Club in 2004 broken and hurting. "The life I lived before coming to the ALANO Club was unmanageable and dysfunctional. Those who know me can see the good changes. Today I am employable. I'm a Mom and a Grandmother. I have four kids. And, I'm no longer homeless. I've been able to maintain a home for the past eight years." Tammy continued; "I've had a few relapses over the years. However, since 2004, I've been able to accumulate five years of being Clean and Sober."

A few weeks ago, as I waited at the bus stop after the meeting, I noticed a shiny older automobile going past. Tammy was at the wheel and waved at me... So, I asked her about her car. She smiled and said, "I drive my son's car, a 1968 Plymouth Satellite Station Wagon. I get lots of compliments and every day I get offers to buy it."

Tammy had nothing but praise for her co-workers. She works with Mary, Regina, Angela, Terri, Cassandra, and Kiki. "Kiki works all over the place here. He is very friendly and helps everybody. Kiki is a husband, a father, and a step-father. He is the Assistant Manager of the Club, and manages the staff and volunteers. His boss is Tony Baron, the Manager of the Club."

The ALANO Club has many volunteers, according to Tammy. The majority of the volunteers are court-ordered. "However, we also have several students who are here, doing community service for their school. I often run across a student who doesn't know how to work. I help them by talking to them in such a way that they don't feel bad about accepting helpful instructions." Work projects can include Kitchen duty, food prep, cleaning, landscaping, and other duties which need to be done. The green awning (roof) over the counter area in the café was done by a volunteer.

I then asked Tammy; What Is Your Advice to the Newcomer?

"IF YOU FALL, GET BACK-UP. THE SLOGAN, 'KEEP COMING BACK' REALLY WORKS. FOLLOW SUGGESTIONS AND DON'T TRY TO DO IT YOUR WAY. THERE IS ALWAYS TIME TO ATTEND A MEETING. I'M REALLY GRATEFUL FOR THE ALANO CLUB. THIS PLACE HAS SAVED MY BUTT."

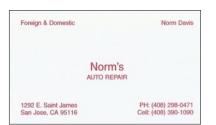
