It is easy to let up on the spiritual program of action and rest on our laurels. We are headed for trouble if we do, for alcohol is a subtle foe.



Why I am a Member of the Alano Club of San Jose

One Member's Story - Angela Y.

Who Are You? "My name is Angela Landin-Young. I am a single mother of three and have been blessed with one grandchild. I have worked at The Café Alano for five years. I really enjoy working here and cooking. I have met a lot of nice people whom I enjoy serving. I appreciate The Alano Club for giving me a second chance."

Tell Me About Your Early Home Life? "My mother abandoned my two brothers and I. A family in Fresno adopted us when I was seven years old. This was not a good place for us because these people were abusive in several ways. So I left at twelve years old. I was in and out of Juvenile Hall and Group Homes. I used to run away a lot, often sleeping on the streets. I didn't care about myself or anything in life. I remember feeling like the ugly duckling, not having anyone who cared about me. At the age of sixteen I began caring about myself. I started to work on my life. I taught myself my own values and morals in life. I studied more in school. I believed in myself and felt I could do this by myself."

When Did You Have Your First Drink? "I started drinking at the age of twelve. My friends and I used to steel vodka. At first it was fun, but I began drinking everyday. At this age I didn't feel like I belonged anywhere, so why care about myself, nobody else did? I lived like this everyday for two years. At the age of fifteen I tried cocaine which resulted in me almost getting raped. That really scared me. I remember running for a long time, stopping and crying. Thinking to my self – something has got to change!"

When Did You Have Your Last Drink? I haven't had a drink for eight years. I know by now that if I get started it would result in me wanting more. I face many issues everyday, sober. I know that drinking is not the solution. I feel myself a strong woman and plan to stay that way."

How Did You Find Out About A.A.? "I went to all of the AA and NA meetings I could when I was in jail. I learned a lot from the stories people told about how and why they stopped. And more importantly...how to stay stopped!"

What Is Your Advice for the New Comer? "The Alano Club is a great place for you to have a fresh start in life. All of the people here are very nice and are like family. There are a lot of people here who are great sponsors, and truly care about newcomers. The support is available, you just need to ask. Most of the people here are in recovery also, so you don't have to look hard or long to find someone who shares your story. Becoming a member of The Club helps keep the doors open for the next person, like yourself, who needs a helping hand."

Please Pay Your Membership:

Please pay your membership if you are using the club and remember the price you paid to get here. I belong to other kinds of clubs and organizations, they didn't keep me sober. I personally like coming to a well lit, clean, happy place for meetings. I am happy to find what I need here. I can buy lunch, visit with a sponsee, go to a meeting and use the bathroom if needed. Let's continue to become successful, recovering members.
