Why I Am a Member – By Laura Michiko Kimura

*Who Are You? "*My name is Laura and I am most definitely an alcoholic. Born in Los Angeles to Japanese parents, I was an only child. Soon thereafter Mom and Dad moved to Tokyo, and we lived there until I completed Kindergarten. My first and second grades were in LA and then we moved to Yokohama, Japan, where I attended St. Maur Int'I School. I was graduated in 1995. By working five jobs, I was able to save-up enough money that I came to Claremont, CA. for college in 1996. I moved there with two suitcases, \$3,000 and dreams of becoming an American citizen.

Laura, When Was Your First Drink? How Did Your Mind Convince You To Try It? "I discovered the existence of alcohol in my toddler years, when "amazake" was served to children in lieu of "real sake" on traditional festive holidays. It's a rice-thickened sake with alarming amounts of sugar. It's super sweet and rice-pulpy but with a definite alcoholic taste..... When I turned 13 I started coming home late, started smoking, seeing boyfriends; that whole teen-thing quickly became nothing new and drinking was one of them. I did however, cherish my time on-stage as a 'classical pianist.'.....[In Japan, at that time] "there was no carding system, no ID-ing, and it was very easy to step into bars in my Catholic school uniform. I drank with my parents by 10th grade and was finishing their half cups of beer that they couldn't finish. I could drink almost anyone under the table and I wore it like a badge of honor."

When Was Your Last Drink? "It was the afternoon of May 22, 2012. I had relapsed with my partner one more time – drinking for three days. My son, Morgan, was seven months old. I helped him into the car seat in the CPS worker's car. 'Momo' gave the loudest and craziest shriek I've ever heard and I knew he sensed something bad was happening. He was terrified out of his mind. The next morning, I awoke to a silent apartment – hung-over, lonely, broken hearted, and thirsty beyond comprehension. I craved OJ, and opened the refrigerator to find a block of cheese. My first thought was, 'wine would go great with that.' That was my earth-shattering moment of utter demoralization and true defeat. My sobriety birthday is May 23, 2012.

Laura, How Did You Find Out About AA? "I lived in Boulder, CO, from 2003 to 2007 with my husband. It was my first 'geographic', hoping that my drinking habits would die down, but it was quite the opposite. Marriage was declining like falling from a cliff. I knew by 2004 that I had a drinking problem. But I'm Japanese, a party animal, the odd-ball chick who could out-drink almost anyone around me. I hung-out with pot-heads during college so I could finish their drinks...free booze, Yeah! But now, I had to drink alone because I started losing friends....My husband was an atomic physics-researching PhD. candidate who worked 80-hours a week. I searched online one day and called Boulder's AA hotline. A man answered. I broke down and said, 'I can't do this anymore!' He replied, 'You're gonna be alright. Just hang in there, and I'll have a female AA member call you shortly.' A little later, a lady called but in a few minutes my husband walked in, unexpectedly...and she asked if it was a good time to chat. I specifically remember saying, 'no. Actually, I'm okay now. I don't think I need any help. Thank you anyway and have a great day.' That was my first contact with AA.

How Did You Find Out About the Alano Club of San Jose? "It was 2011. I lived within walking distance of the Denny's Restaurant at First Street and Alma. I went there for awhile with my son in a 'stroller-car seat thingy' and I heard a gentleman make daily announcements that Cup of Coffee was a great meeting. He called it 'Alano East' at the time....When I checked out that meeting a tall man came to me and said essentially that I was welcome but not to bring my son. Then I relapsed the following May. In 2016, Morgan started pre-K, and I had three hours of glorious me-time and I decided to spend it on AA. However, it took some counseling with my sponsor to get over my resentment of the Alano Club and the rude man who didn't want my son to attend my meetings. I became an Alano Club member in early 2017.I feel rich because I'm loved by my crazy, cute, smart, athletic, skateboarding, autistic, ADHD son, his handsome Daddy – whom I love endlessly, and my peeps at the Club where they get me because they're just as sick, crazy and twisted as I am!


