Why I Am a Member of the Alano Club of San Jose By Sue E.

Who are You? My name is Sue Erskin, my sobriety birthday is February 7, 2009. I worked for AT&T for 30yrs. I'm enjoying a sober life with my husband Jim J., who is also a member of the Alano Club.

<u>What age were you when you had your first drink?</u> I was 15 years old. It was the summer after my sophomore year. I was looking forward to the upcoming year of school because I was very active in student activities. Honestly, drinking alcohol was not even on my 'radar.'

"My father, whom I really looked up to, had arranged for a crew of men to come and help him pour cement in our back yard. I asked if I could help, but dad did not take me up on my offer. The day of 'the pour', at 6am, I heard the cement truck arrive, the air brakes woke me up. Still stinging from being turned down, I stayed in my room. I could hear my dad's voice, he sounded mad and excited, and suddenly I had a knock at my bedroom door. Apparently, the 'crew' hadn't shown up yet, and he was pretty desperate for help. I sprung into action. A couple neighbors came over to help. I was able to work side by side with my dad, screeding. When the other guys showed up, he asked me to remain. My head was spinning with pride, as you could well imagine.

"The BBQ was lit, beer on ice, mom sprung into action, yet I wasn't asked to help in the kitchen. Soon, dad ceremoniously handed the beers out, and gave me one. Along with the beer, came a short speech about his pride in his daughter for being so much help. I chased that feeling for 33 years.

<u>When did you have your last drink or drug?</u> "February 6th, 2009. I had driven myself to rehab, which is exactly what they told me not to do. I had brought with me a six-pack of my favorite beer, and some 'other stuff' I needed to say 'Good-Bye' to. I sat in my car, parked in front of The Camp Recovery Center, and said 'so-long' to my friends; then I checked into the admissions office.

How did you find out about AA? "When I was at The Camp, H&I brought meetings in every night at 8pm. They were mandatory. It didn't take me long to start to look forward to them.

<u>When did you first find out about The Alano Club of San Jose?</u> "As my 28 day stay at The Camp was coming to an end, we were given a meeting guide and asked to go to at least one meeting a day. The Alano Club was close to my home, and had many meeting times available. It's funny though, on my way home from rehab, I remember thinking to myself "I better stop off at this 'Club' and see if it was going to be the 'oasis' my intuition was telling me it was going to be." I was not disappointed!

<u>When and how did the "Promises" begin to appear in your life?</u> "It took me a few months to get a sponsor and start my steps. Prior to doing so, I remember thinking why do I need to do all of that work?" One of the senior members advised me that if I didn't work the steps with a sponsor, the chances of relapse are huge. By this time, I really wanted to stay sober, so I took his advice.

<u>Why are you a member of The Alano Club?</u> "Out of gratitude. I was on The Club's Board of Directors for a few years. I know how important it is to the future of The Club to have as many paying members as possible. Besides, the burgers are less expensive that way.

<u>Advice for the newcomer?</u> "Reach out and ask for help. Find a sponsor who can help you through your steps. Attend at least one meeting a day, you will soon find that you want to go to meetings. Take advantage of the support you can find at The Alano Club, I spent many hours just hanging out there, with other people in recovery. It felt as if my destructive way of thinking would just take a break when I was there. I could just relax and breathe. Make up your mind to recover, set the intention and then follow through. You can't do it alone, but then again, who would want to?"
